Technical Excellence


Best supporting actor/actress — Abigail Sage for Girl

Committee report 26th February and 26th March 2015

We had committee meetings on 26th February and 26th March 2015. This is what we have been talking about.

We talked about our February production, *My Own Show*. Once again we produced a play that we can be proud of.

We discussed the one act play; *After midnight, before dawn*, at both meetings. This play has now been to the Sawston drama festival. It did very well, winning several nominations and being chosen 2nd overall best play. The play will be performed on April 11th at the Settlement.

Helen Faulkner is now rehearsing two other short plays to go on on April 11th.

The June production, the Ladykillers, is now cast and in rehearsal

We talked about the possibility of running some workshops at the Settlement. We are going to try and arrange a stage combat course in June and then another workshop of some kind in the autumn.

We talked about publicity. We have prepared some posters and have placed some adverts for the one act play night in April. Our June production has been included in the programme for the Letchworth Festival so will benefit from their advertising.

We discussed the website. I reported that we were very pleased with how things were going and that we had managed to do a lot more than we had expected to by now. There are now a few documents in the members' area and I shall be sending the password to those people who have paid their subscriptions.

We talked about social events but everyone is so busy with rehearsals at the moment that it is unlikely that we will sort anything out before June.

We talked about on-line ticketing. We are the only theatre group locally who don't sell tickets on-line and if you live outside of Letchworth it can be difficult to get tickets for our productions. So, some of us would like to start selling our tickets on-line perhaps via our website. We are looking into several different ways of doing this and hope to bring a proposal to the AGM for the membership to vote on. We feel that this will be a major step and the decision should be made by us all.

It was decided that after show parties would always be held in the hall rather than the Brunt room. This would make it much easier to tidy up afterwards and wouldn't involve having to pay Settlement staff to come in and clean up after us.

We looked at various types of cushions for our seats. The seats in the hall can be quite uncomfortable so we are thinking about buying cushions for them to make coming to see us a little more comfortable for our audience.

Jeni Gosling may be going on a theatre costume workshop. This would be of great benefit to the Players and the productions we put on.

Finally, we discussed the arrangements for the one act play night and are now confident that everything that needs to be done is in hand and we are sure that the one act play night will be a great success.

Official minutes of our meetings are now available.

Our next meeting will be on at the beginning of May. If there is anything that you want to be discussed by the committee then please let me or any of the committee members know.



Thank you to those of you who have made suggestions. I would still welcome any further comments or suggestions.


